ALL HALLOWS CHURCH - EINGMORE Churchyard - Provision of Burial Plots

We are in the position of needing to provide burial plots as we have only 2 remaining spaces. There is no suitable land for purchase available nearby and we shall shortly have no burial plots left.

The Rev. Preb. P. Stevens visited the churchyard in July to discuss what options were open to us. His advice was to re-use the space as outlined on the attached drawing as with the exception of 1 headstone, dating to 1984 which will be left in situ, the remaining stones date to over 100 years old.

The proposal is to remove 32 stones - Kingmore requires 2/3 spaces a year - so this would provide approximately space for 10 years. Preb. Stevens' recommendation being that the old headstones be removed and re-sited within the churchyard boundary with space to strim behind.

Preb. Stevens has consulted with the Archdeacon on this proposal.

There are no known relatives of families whose stones would be affected living in the village; a notice will be placed in the village newsletter for October.

The Diocesan Registry have recommended notices be placed in 2 local newspapers at the same time as the citation is placed on the church.

Dear Mrs Wood.

I write with reference to our letter of 14th October 1999 in which we advised you of the proposal to remove certain gravestones in the Churchyard so that new spaces will be made available for burial. I can report that a Diocesan Faculty has been granted and advertisements placed in 2 local newspapers without anyone raising objections to the Scheme -- but at a total cost of £300. Now a workforce is required to move the headstones within the Churchyard -- an initial quote from a local Nursery is between £880 - £1,100, depending on the exact work required. Before proceeding to obtain further quotes we would ask the Parish Council to consider sharing with us equally the cost of this operation.

You will realise that having these spaces available will enable demand to be met for possibly the next decade and avoid the need for the Parish Council to purchase further land for burial purposes.

We hope you will feel in sympathy with our request and await your decision.
