 Vnto her fifteen rods just twenty-one.

 The distance that she started up before

 Was four score fifteen rods just and no more!

 Now this I'd have you unto me declare –

 How far they ran before they caught the hare?

(After this, the Scribe, I suppose to bring himself to a more serious frame of mind, wrote out the Nunc Dimittis in full, and the Second Collect for Morning Frayer.)
