In reply to your note of 22.11.05 I have gathered the following information on the Lime Kiln at Challaborough.

At the time of the sale of the village in 1862 there were 3 lime kilns operational.

On the 1885 Ordnance Survey map 2 lime kilns are shown. One of these kilns has since disappeared but the other (at SX6474 4498) is extant but ruined. This one is included in the Archaeological Check-List for Ringmore (No.118) and is listed in the Devon County Sites and Monuments Register (CIN 45124).

The Manor Rent List for 1850 and the 1851 Census show that two "lime burners", John Randle and William Ryder, lived in what is now Smugglers Cottage, Ringmore.

Although there are better examples of lime kilns along the Devon coast the remains at Challaborough are important to Ringmore as the one remaining link with our "sea port" from a time when road transport was very difficult; as an illustration of agricultural methods used in the area and as an indication of one of the sources of employment for our villages.

I hope this information is sufficient for English Heritage to list the Lime Kiln.
