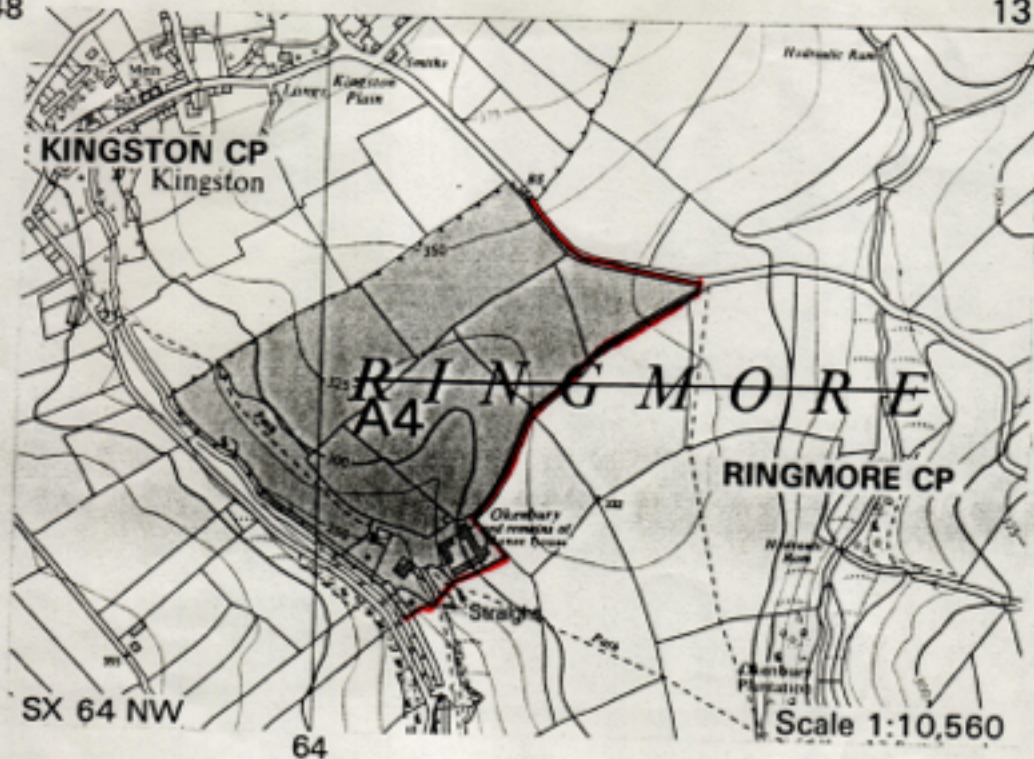

Boundary Commission Recommendation of Working Party

Dear Sir,

At a recent meeting of the Ringmore Parish Council following a parish meeting attended by a representative from Kingston Parish Council and parishioners of this parish it was unanimously agreed to inform your Council that the parish of Ringmore does not wish to join the parish of Kingston. Furthermore, it is understood that the parish of Kingston has no wish to join Ringmore.

Reasons :- No positive benefits have been put forward for such a Union, neither has it been proved that greater efficiency in Administering the parishes will follow such amalgamation.

The Ringmore Parish Council wish to draw the attention of the District Council to the history of the parochial Church Councils of these villages. Following the joining of the parish Councils the administration of Church affairs proved so unsatisfactory in each parish that it was decided to dissolve the Union. From 1948 each parish has had it's own Councils.

It is felt that these communities are of such widely different natures that the proposed amalgamation would destroy the particular quality of life in each parish. The fear was expressed that the parishioners of Ringmore would not wish to represent a larger community and therefore their particular influence would in time be lost to their village.

Geographically there are no obvious reasons for your recommendations. The contour of the existing boundary makes a natural division that is entirely satisfactorily.

Economically there would seem no advantage to be gained.

The District representative already covers two parishes and a joint parish Clerk would not show any financial saving.

Historically Ringmore has shown a marked ability to manage it's own affairs and through the ages has always maintained a sturdy independence that should be allowed to continue.

Much of the charm of the South Hams is the individuality of the parishes that lie within it's boundaries.

Ringmore feels very strongly that such individuality should be allowed to flourish.

A petition supporting these objections to the recommendations of your Council will be forwarded under separate cover.
