Parish Council News Footpaths. The new Assistant Heritage Coast Officer, Mr. Carter, attended the last Council Meeting. He now has responsibility for footpaths in this area and he has undertaken to discuss, with Mr. Major, the possible need to widen the Coastal Path near Challaborough and, with Mr. Perraton, the possibility of using Manpower Services Commission labour to improve the footpaths leading to Ayrmer Cove. He is also discussing, with the farmer concerned, the possibility of establishing a footpath from Kingston to Westcombe Beach. Trees. The Souncil is concerned about changes in the character of the village, due to

the loss of trees. Within the Conservation Area, householders who have to fell dead and dying trees now have an obligation to plant new ones in their place. However, many trees were lost before these regulations were introduced and the Council is considering whether it might be possible for them to plant, in the village, small saplings of native trees, which would mature in 20-30 years and restore the village to its former beauty. Such saplings are available free of charge from Devon Council. A small sub-committee will be discussing this with individual householders and will be very pleased to receive suggestions of suitable sites for planting.

Water Supplies. The Council has not yet received a reply from South West Water to its suggestion that the level of the Avon Dam should be raised, in order to increase the summer water supply by two million gallons a day. Our letter concluded: - "We resent the imposition of increased charges to pay for a lack of water and would far rather pay

for measures which would provide water when we need it most".

A copy of the letter was sent to Mr. Anthony Steen M.P. who has strongly supported the Parish Council and has written to the D.O.E. as follows:- "S.West Water have been unable, over the two years I have been in Devon, to provide the commodity which the water rate is supposed to cover. Thus constituents are by statute compelled to pay for a product which the statutory undertaker has good cause to believe he cannot provide

for some parts of the year".

The Council will invite S.W. Water to send a representative to the Annual Parish Meeting on 9 April. It is hoped that many members of the public will attend to ques-

tion this representative about mis-management of water supplies.
