RINGMORE HISTORICAL SOCIETY.

70 Years ago. July 1915. "Our Roll of Honour"

Extract. "Two more names have been added to our Parochial Roll of Honour, bringing the full number of men serving to 21 out of a population of 150. The two latest volunteers, who have enlisted with the 7th. Devons for foreign service are Ernest and Arthur Miller. Mr. Miller has now four sons and one son-in-law with the colours, and the Ringmore Choir has provided six recruits for the new armies.

Aug. 1915. Pound Day. We sent 40 lbs. of various goods this year to the Cottage
Hospital. The Farish Depot was at the Post Office where Flossie Bardens very ably and successfully presided. (Note. A list of 21 donors is given.)

60 Years ago. August 1925.
"The Fete": The appointed day 12 August was hopelessly wet and the only course was to postpone the fete to the following day: most of us feared that this would mean a very serious loss, but the glorious weather of Thursday 13 gave us new heart, and the success achieved exceeded our most sanguine expectations. The takings amounted the success achieved exceeded our most sanguine expectations. to more than £65, a most gratifying result. (Note. Lady Mildmay who has to have opened the fete the previous day could not do so on the Thursday but did visit during the afternoon after opening the Stokenham Fete.)

"The Folk Dancing and Costume Songs by the children were impensely popular and won general admiration and praise, and everyone was charmed by the accomplished perform-

ance of the Orchestra from Modbury."
