to remove the clippings and rubbish.

Just before Easter, I also painted the small 'Challaborough' sign outside the post office, as it has been in disrepair for a number of years. I hope this will make it a little easier for strangers to find their way.

# The Rector writes -

With the meeting of the Ringmore Church Council on Monday 10th, our three Church Councils will have all considered the pastoral scheme for the reorganisation of our parishes. The scheme will come into operation upon my retirement and will involve the formation of a team ministry centred on Modbury and incorporating no less than seven parishes and eight churches.

The Team Rector would be based at Modbury with John Cole taking on this new role. Then a house will be purchased in Loddiswell and a Team Vicar appointed, with a special responsibility for that village, Woodleigh and East Allington. Additionally, it is planned to maintain a base here in Ringmore, with the house occupied by a retired clergyman on a "house-for-duty" basis.

Doreen and I hope that we might stay on here for a while in that capacity more or less half-time. In practical terms there would probably be little change to
our pattern of Sunday worship as the team got under way. We cannot be altogether
sure about when all this could begin, but we have wondered about making November
30th our retirement day so that the scheme could come into operation just before
Christmas. We shall see!



Our regular evenings of Euchre on Wednesday and Quiz on Thursday will continue


throughout May, and our live music programme is as follows:

\* Two parishioners attended the meeting in addition to the five councillors present; Rob Batten and Guy Eddy were both away, so the vice-chairman, John Tate, chaired his first meeting.

\* The telephone 'Watch-a-Box' scheme has now been discontinued by British Telecom. Perhaps by coincidence vandals have already damaged the plastic display unit inside.

Thanks were conveyed to Val Dyer for her watchfulness.

\* It was reported that sludge is expected to be removed from the sewerage treatment plant about twice a month in a 'medium-sized' vehicle, and that some smell will occur at times of loading.

\* A reminder to all that the skips will be sited at the Journey's End car park on 17th

May, and at Challaborough on 24th May

\* The National Trust are deliberating on concerns expressed about the barbed wire placed along the fence towards Toby's Point. The Council decided not to take action until further contact from the National Trust.

It was agreed that signs were important but inadequate, and that traffic-calming measures (ramps) were essential. Technical advice would be obtained before mounting a campaign to get the necessary work done to prevent a serious accident.
