


#### KEN WARD'S MEMORIES OF SOUTH DEVON 1940 - from Reg Trant

The detachment comprised Radio Operators, German speakers from Intelligence Corps, Drivers, Despatch Rider, Radio Mechanic and a Cook and 1 NCO (Cpl Bennett). With the aid of the local policeman we took over the annexe to the village inn as the men's billet and the cook set up his field kitchen on the grass between the road and the beach.

After watching this activity for a day or so the village wives came to me and said "Your cook is just ruining good food - we will cook for your lads from now on" and they did.

Also at Beesands was a detachment of the 11th Durham Light Infantry under 2/Lt Tommy Walker and at the North End of the Bay about 100 Royal Engineers to build beach defences. They were all Clydeside Dock workers commanded by their civil boss 2/Lt Matt Taylor and a Scots Guards reservist Sergeant Major who was a great character. There was a Platoon of Devons guarding the BBC station at Start Point. Another detachment of Durham Light Infantry at Stoke Fleming, and Durham Light Infantry Unit HQ at Halwell from whom we drew pay and rations. Tommy, Matt and I billeted ourselves at the Crabpot Cafe in real comfort. The only other service personnel between Dartmouth and Plymouth Naval Areas were RAF with a small radar station just west of Burgh Island.

## Rainfall



#### ROYAL BRITISH LEGION VJ COMMEMORATION

As advised last month the VJ Commemoration Service will take place at Bigbury Church at 11

am on Sunday 13th August 1995. This special service will commemorate the 50th Anniversary of the end of the Second World

War, and we hope that the occasion will be very well supported.

On Saturday afternoon 19th August 1995 the Bigbury Parish Council are planting a Commemoration tree in the grounds behind the Memorial Hall at St. Anne's Chapel. The Royal British Legion have been invited to attend; actual times will be notified later. GUY EDDY, POPPY APPEAL ORGANISER.

#### RINGMORE PARISH COUNCIL

District Councillor Roger Anstey reported that Harraton Cross Highways will not accept permanent 30 mph speed limits on A379, nor will they consider a mirror for drivers travelling from Bigbury and California Cross. Mirrors have their own disadvantages and will only be used at bad accident spots.

Mrs A Carson (Modbury School Governor) reported on the developments concerning the new school classroom. The children will be taking part in a sponsored walk along the Plym Valley on Saturday 16th September and it is hoped that as many people will sponsor this worthwhile cause to raise funds for the PTA and new classroom.

Car Parking Crossways Parish Council are still trying to resolve this problem and it is hoped that a solution will be available for our September meeting.

Traffic Calming A site inspection has confirmed that the strips are in line with specification. Parish Council have agreed to increase the 3 strips to 10 and the colour to be a slightly paler grey to see if this will have a greater effect on reducing speed. Councillors are strongly supporting the 'Driving Speeds Down in Devon' campaign, more literature has been requested and it is hoped that we can arrange a speaker on this subject to attend our September meeting.

Village Skip Service After much pressure on our part we have finally succeeded in obtaining this service back in the village. Two skips will be placed in the Parish during March 1996.

Trees Once again free trees will be available along with hedging plants. Requests for hedging should mention that they are required to be planted in salty air conditions.
