

## Ringmore Parish Council

Excerpts from the minutes of the November Meeting

The Public and Councillors were treated to entertaining talks by Roger Anstey, our District Councillor, and also by Daniel McCarthy of Devon Highways.

Roger Anstey spoke about AGENDA 21 which concerns all our futures with respect to the environment and quality of life. Seminars, to be held in the South Hams at various locations, will carry on through January & February and everyone with an interest in the future is urged to attend one.

Daniel McCarthy gave a very interesting, informative and light-hearted talk about 'Driving Speeds Down in Devon'. Apparently the biggest problem is not young hooligans on the road but ordinary people, like you and me, who don't realise the fact that they are driving at a speed which endangers others. Not many people get knocked down by a car doing 80 mph. Most are killed or injured by cars doing less than 40! Speeding needs to be dealt with at a local level and the Council agreed to look at the setting up of a local action group to improve the problems we have.

The Council is to look at local road signing with a view to directing visitors away from problem parking spots and towards such places as the new National Trust Car Park. Also the road designation of those such as Rocky Path is to be checked upon.

A Freephone number for the National Rivers Authority is now available for problems or complaints:- 0800 80 70 60

Donations of £35 towards the fireworks and £5 towards the Inter-Parish Quiz were agreed. Thanks are due to all those involved in the organisation of these events.

The Newsletter proposals were postponed until the December meeting due to personal problems intervening to prevent a pre-meeting discussion with the editors.

Devon 2011 was discussed with views being many and varied due to the all-encompassing nature of the plan. Two proposals were passed by the Council, to be relayed to County Hall. One was that there should be no new town built within the South Hams and the other that there be no low-cost housing development in the Parish, unless the need should become apparent. The need is not apparent as low-cost housing in Kingston has had trouble finding enough residents.


## TEN YEARS AGO



## Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal 1995

As we draw to the end of 1995 it has been a most remarkable year for our local Royal British Legion. Following on from the VE and VJ Anniversary celebrations, I reminded you that the ordinary work of the Legion had to carry on and that was why the annual Poppy Appeal was so important. I must admit that I wondered whether the National Lottery would have an effect on our collections. I'm happy to say that I was proved to be totally wrong to even consider the possibility. Last year's record total of £1870 was completely shattered with an incredible total of £2220. The following shows the breakdown of how this figure was achieved.

The annual Auction was held on Friday 10th November at 9pm at the Journey's End Inn, by kind permission of James and Gillian Parkin. Under the persuasive hammer of Rob Batten, a remarkable £705 was realised for the Poppy Appeal. Many and varied were the items sold, including a number of pledges and two pictures painted by a local artist. Valuable assistance was rendered by Fiona, doing the book-keeping and Stan, David and Reg doing the humping and heaving. To add to this, the whisky raffle realised £93. A remarkable night.

On Saturday morning, 11th November, the Coffee Morning was held at Sedgewell Sands, Bigbury-on-Sea, by kind permission of Mr & Mrs Jack Smith. The weather was unfriendly but people turned out in great numbers and a record £360 was raised. A feature of the event was the re-introduction of the 2 minute silence at 11.00am, which was appreciated by those present. A big 'Thank you' to all the helpers.

On Sunday morning, 12th November, the Remembrance Service was held at Ringmore Church and conducted by Mr Michael Tagent. In his sermon he reminded us that we should not only remember those who gave their lives but think about how and why these sacrifices came about. A splendid service realised a further £138 for the Appeal.

On Monday evening 13th November, the last event, the Whist Drive, was held at Ringmore WI Hall and was organised by the Ladies Branch. A further £50 plus £20.50 for wreaths was raised for the Poppy Appeal.

The Ringmore WI gave a donation of £10 to the Appeal.

Meantime, from the beginning of November, our collectors had been out and about the three parishes knocking on doors and together with static boxes in pubs, clubs and shops, they raised a further £842, once again a record.

This has been another wonderful effort by a very dedicated team. However I must point out that the team is fairly mature to say the least and we are inevitably losing some of our older members. No less than five stalwarts of earlier years have passed away this year. To carry on the good work we need new members to help us. If you are interested why not have a chat with a member near you.
