

All Hallows, Ringmore

This month, we are in the season of Lent. As I write these lines, I have just been reading an article in the "Independent" on the subject of fasting, dieting and health foods. The writer of the article seems to think that these all are a "good thing". One would assume, then, that the ancient Church practice of "giving things up for Lent" would be taken up with enthusiasm by people today, at least in the overfed and overweight parts of our hemisphere. And yet it is as unfashionable to do this as it is to go to Church at all. Dieting, yes, but fasting - mega-out.

Have we got our message wrong? Should we not as a Church be "into the health food business"? Funnily enough: we are! We believe on feeding on the Word of God. We receive the physical and spiritual food of the Holy Communion. We talk of the Church as the Body of Christ, and seek to keep that Body sleek and lean, making room for each member (limb) of the Body to play his or her part for the good of the whole. But somehow this message does not

get through to most people.

Without doubt, this is partly because we are pretty ineffective in the way we convey our message. Or our lives lack some of that transparency for the message that is so essential to its communication. But it's also because those who could be listening just aren't. It doesn't seem to apply to them, even though it might be good for others! But listening to what God has to say, and trying to live by it, is a very good "diet" indeed. egg yolks 75g icing sugar 450g mascarpone 125g sponge fingers 300ml strong black coffee 75ml brandy

Tiramisu

This delicious Italian dessert has been provided by Annie King. The recipe serves eight and from the look of it, it could be dangerous to exceed the recommended dosell

Preparation:

Whisk together the egg yolks and icing sugar and then fold in the mascarpone. Line the base of an oblong dish with a layer of sponge fingers. Mix together the coffee and the brandy and pour one third (no tastingl) of the mixture over the sponge fingers. Cover this with one third of the masacarpone mix. Repeat this process twice more, ending with the final layer of mascarpone. Chill for at least 6 hours. Serve, decorated with grated chocolate.






