As Guy Eddy suggested, perhaps a Public Meeting would have been the best way of publicising the issue and determining any concerted approach to possible acquisition. Alas, no one thought to do so. We are all blessed with 20/20 hindsight!

A much more significant event occurred during the month in connection with the fire at the National Trust Barn. There was stock in there at the time and it might not have been saved but for the presence of mind of George Freeman and Colin Jackson. Their efforts were commended at the Parish

Council meeting and their prompt action will be remembered long after the saga of Burnett's Orchard is a faded memory.

Stop Press

Burnett's Orchard has been bought by A M King & Sons. The speed of the Bush Telegraph means that this is probably not news to many of you. Alan says, "I know others wanted the land to give it to the National Trust but I hope that they will be reassured to learn that apart from some alteration at the entrance to the drive, the addition of some trees and, perhaps, a pond, there will be no significant change. The Bonfire Venue is safe and I look forward to seeing everyone there on November 5th!".

The 171/2 acres of land at Noddon Mill, part of Marwell Farm, was purchased by The National Trust.





Meeting on 23rd April

Present: 7 councillors, 7 members of the public and Mr R Anstey, District Councillor

Skateboarding

No further developments as no area of land has been suggested as suitable so far. The Clerk will write to Bigbury Parish Council to see what they can do.

Trees

Following the collapse of the tree at Town Well, Treescape Arborists are to be invited to fell further trees and clear the timber around the Town Well according to their specification and tender.

District Council Report

Mr Anstey talked in general about the work of the District Council. In view of the Milford Haven Oil disaster, SHDC is trying to obtain the services of a tug at short notice in the event of any similar disaster happening around the Devon coast.

Anyone entitled to a free Radon test should contact the National Radiation Protection Board, Chiltern, Didcot, Oxfordshire, Tel 01235 831600, before the free testing is ended.

The eradication of wasps and /or fleas now costs £20 but if you have any trouble with rats, that service is still free.

Neighbourhood Watch

To make sure that the bus shelter is visible in the hours of darkess, the Parochial Church Council has agreed that the lights at the entrance to the church can be switched on, at certain times, during the night in Winter. The finance is to be discussed between the PCC and the Parish Council.

With regard to the recent fire at the barn on National Trust land, we are very grateful to Mr George Freeman and Mr Colin Jackson for their prompt and commendable action.

Car Parking Signs

The SHDC has made the following proposals:

- Move the cul-de-sac sign at the bus shelter to the wall.
- Place the waste bin at the side of the shelter.
- Split the chevron sign in two and put each half on either side of the front of the shelter.
- Add an arm to the sign post, under Challaborough, indicating The National Trust Car Park.
 The Parish Council agreed to all the proposals except No 3.

Burnett's Orchard

The Chairman explained the position of the councillors with regard to the leaflet. It appears that there has been a lack of communication between concerned parishioners and the Council. Mrs Rachel Pitt said that she would have been willing to attend an extra council meeting to discuss the matter had it been proposed and would do so in future should urgent issues need attending to. Mr Guy Eddy stated that perhaps there should have been a public meeting. Mrs Theima Mann proposed that the Council should discuss, as soon as possible, a policy of whether the Council should or should not buy land, as and when it became available, as a village amenity.

Rocky Path Seat

The seat presented to mark the Coronation in 1953 has broken, possibly due to 'fair wear and tear'. It has been decided to obtain a new one, preferably in hardwood.

Rumble Strips

The recent remedy of increasing the level and number of strips from three to ten appears to be a considerable improvement. The clerk is to write to the Highways Department to this effect and to thank them.

Planning

Additional bedroom over the kitchen at the rear of Ivy Cottage.

The Council had no objection but expressed the reservation that the proposed new roof should not be higher than the existing cottage roof.

Ayrmer Beach

It was decided to leave cleaning for the time being as the beach was quite tidy. Should the situation change, the decision will be reviewed.


