### Parish Council - Money Matters

The Parish Council has recently had a number of requests to spend money on a variety of projects and improvements in the parish, which parishioners and the Parish Council support. However, we have a problem!

Most of the Parish Council income comes from the 'precept', which is the amount the Parish Council asks South Hams District Council (SHDC) to collect and forms part of your Council Tax. Therefore, the more (or less) we ask for, the more (or less) you pay as part of your Council Tax. There are 61 parishes in the South Hams. This year 28 Parish Councils levied a higher amount than Ringmore per household and 32 levied less, so we are average. This year SHDC asked Parish Councils to keep precepts to a minimum. Ringmore kept to the same as last year, 42 Councils increased their precept, so we are one of the better Councils at keeping costs down. Our precept this year is £1,200.

The problem this year is that in addition to our normal expenditure, we are having to find £529 for the parish election (which we did anticipate); £400 to cover damage to property from the fallen tree at the Town Well; £450 for tree felling and pruning to make safe the other trees at the Town Well as well as replacing the 'Jubilee' seat.

We are looking to external sources of funding and will be encouraging local fundraising towards some of the projects the parish wishes to support but some of our usual donations/contributions will have to be curtailed this year. It is also likely that next year's precept might need to increase until our finances are back on even keel.

I thought I should put you all in the picture and invite you to contact any of your parish councillors with useful suggestions.



# RINGMORE PARISH COUNCIL

Meeting 18th June - 6 councillors (apologies from Rachel Pitt) and 3 members of the public

### Grass/Vegetation cutting

Town Well

The King family have, over a considerable period, kept this area neat and tidy. However, they now state that they no longer wish to undertake this voluntary chore. Firstly, the Council offers its sincere thanks to the Kings for their past commitment. Secondly, do we have, in the village, a volunteer to take on this work for the future?

#### **Bus Shelter**

Brian McCabe has agreed to continue his voluntary grass cutting of this area.

#### Public Footpaths

Letters have been sent to both The National Trust and English Heritage, pointing out the overgrown state of some of our local footpaths, with a request for remedial action.

#### Skateboarding

An area of land is available behind the Bigbury Memorial Hall at St Anne's Chapel. The SHDC has agreed to tarmacadam this for local youngsters wishing to rollerskate or skateboard. Ultimately, a basketball net will also be provided. Funding will be provided, principally, by SHDC, with contributions from parents and Bigbury & Ringmore Parish Councils. It is anticipated that this facility will become available for the start of the school summer holidays.

### Road re-surfacing

There have been many complaints concerning the recent road re-surfacing, carried out by the County Council Highways Division. As a result of this work, our rumble strips have lost their rumble. We are having words with the Highways Division in this respect.

### Challaborough Rumble Strips

The Parish Council has agreed, in principle, to the provision of ten strips on the lane approaching Challaborough. Financial negotiations are currently taking place.

#### Town Well Tree Felling

This work has now been completed and it is proposed that the resultant timber be sold to defray costs. To this end, an auction will take place at the Town Well on Saturday 6th July at 9.30am. Rob Batten will act as auctioneer.

#### National Trust Car Park

On Saturday 13th June, a car was broken into and the radio stolen at the above car park. Be vigilant, thieves are about.

#### Planning Applications

Applications have been made in respect of The Laurels and Wychwood. The Parish Council raised no objections.

#### **Bus Services**

An opinion poll, in respect of a proposed extension to include Ringmore and Challaborough in the regular bus service, was discussed. If such a service was available, would it be used? Is it a chicken and egg situation?

### **Rocky Path Seat**

Financial constraints have forced a change of plan and other options are being considered but a replacement will be provided.

#### Police

There is to be a Police/Public Liaison meeting on 9th July at Modbury School Hall, commencing at 7.30pm. All are welcome.

The next Parish Council meeting will be on Wednesday 24th July at 7.00pm.


### **Plymouth** 'Spirit of Discovery'?

You may have missed the start of the single-handed Transatlantic race from Plymouth, UK to Newport, Rhode Island, USA, a 3,000 mile voyage across the Atlantic, due to finish in a few week's time. Five local mariners were competing, including a pub landlord (recently rescued), a Plymouth policeman and a Wren, amongst the 58 boats which left Plymouth on Sunday 16th June. Although the event takes place only every four years, the same timing as that other well-publicised Euro event, the scarcity of publicity in the South West for this international event is disappointing. The main French sponsors, Europe 1 Star, a French radio station, festooned Queen Anne's Battery with their signs and flags for over a week and achieved saturation coverage on French TV and National press, whereas in Plymouth, the South West and the rest of the UK, no-one seemed aware the race was happening. Many people, therefore, will have missed the opportunity to witness the splendid spectacle of 60-foot trimarans, sponsored by French companies, Fujicolour, Banque Populaire (overturned whilst leading) and Primagaz (now sunk), waiting at the marina for the start.

If you missed the preparations for the Transatlantic race, you have plenty of time to see a FREE exhibition portraying Plymouth's 'Great Awakening' at the end of the 18th century, featuring the costumes of Sense & Sensibility. The show will include film and photographic extracts from Emma Thompson's diaries, a behind-the-scenes video, and an insight into Plymouth life in the age of Jane Austen. See the exhibition at the City of Plymouth Museum & Art Gallery, Drake Circus, Plymouth (next to the Public Gallery). It is on now until 26th August.

### Two letter about Burnett's Orchard

As an ex-Parish Councillor, I feel that I have to respond to Miss Hilton's letter in the May Newsletter. I fully appreciate and support how strongly she feels about the field being kept as an open space but where I disagree is where she says that the only way to achieve this is by means of the cheque book. If that is the case, my 12 years on the Parish Council have been a waste of time.

There is now in place the Modbury Plan which lays down precisely what may or may not be done in the Parish of Ringmore. This plan is being updated every four years, after consultation with the Parish Council and in each case, so far, has been slightly more restrictive. As a matter of interest, a planning application for this field was rejected a dozen years ago, when limitations were less stringent than they are at present.

A possible course of action that could be considered is that when the Modbury Plan is next updated, a request could be made to declare this field an 'Open Space'. This would protect it from development for the foreseeable future.
