ADVENT

"They look towards heaven and wait for the One who is to come. But it's not from heaven that he's coming. They're looking in vain, because, even as they are looking, behind their backs. the One who is to come is coming."

This verse, even in my inadequate translation, makes me think. All our preparations for Christmas seem to imply that we can plan and determine what lies ahead. Even the calendar of events which we, as a Church, use as an invitation for everyone to share, takes for granted that Advent and Christmas will happen just as we want or imagine. But the verse quoted reminds us that the God who is coming is the God who Himself determines how and when. We haven't got Him in our pockets, though most times we act as if we had. The Bible is very reticent about saying how and when, or even who He is ("I am who I am", as He introduced Himself to Moses at the burning bush, says everything and nothing about God). He's always good for a surprise even covered with tinsel and holly. And that surprise is much greater than any Christmas present could provide - and could very well be life-shattering. Doesn't the birth of the Son of God in the stable at Bethlehem tell us so? Advent invites us to open our eyes - and we might need to look behind our backs



The Bigbury, Ringmore & Kingston branch of The Royal British Legion

This year has seen the 75th Aniiversary of the formation of the Royal British Legion and our three parishes of Bigbury, Kingston and Ringmore have celebrated in the only way they know, by setting a new record. The total of £2561.04p easily topped last year's £2220. Year after year we set ourselves very daunting challenges and year after year, thanks to your wonderful help and generosity, we set new figures. The breakdown of how the figures were achieved is as follows.

On Friday 8th November the annual auction was held at the Journey's End by kind permission of James and Gillian Parkin. Once again Rob Batten wielded his persuasive hammer to great effect, extracting a record £919.50 from very willing bidders. Rob was helped by his wife Fiona, doing the bookkeeping. Backing up were Stan, Brian and David doing the humping and heaving. The whisky raffle realised £100 and further whisky raffle on Saturday and Sunday raised a further £30.

On Saturday 9th November a coffee morning was held at Sedgewell Sands, Bigbury-on-Sea, by kind permission of Joan and Jack Smith. On a fine day a good attendance produced £344 for the appeal, from the cake stall, the bring and buy stall and from 3 raffles. A splendid return for a lot of hard work by many helpers.

On Sunday 10th November, the Remembrance Service was held at Bigbury Church, led by Rev Derek Matten. In his sermon he stressed the importance of not only remembering but reconcilliation as being the way forward. A well-attended service added a further £170 to the appeal. At the conclusion of the service wreaths were laid at the memorial.

On Monday evening, 11th November, the Legion ladies organised a very successful Whist Drive at the WI Hall, Ringmore. An excellent evening added a further £82 to the appeal.

In addition Ringmore WI gave a donation of £10 and two other £10 donations were received.

Meantime during the previous ten days dedicated collectors had been knocking on doors in some very unfriendly weather and they, together with static boxes in pubs, clubs and shops, raised a further £893, another record.

Once again you have ensured that the Royal British Legion's annual call for assistance has not fallen on deaf ears.

Thank you all once again for your wonderful support.







21 - Key of the door (of Knowledge?) The Inter-Parish Quiz 1997


Yes, its the time of year when we start planning for the 1997 Inter-Parish Quiz and this year it reaches its 21st Birthday.
