The Bigbury, Ringmore & Kingston branch of The Royal British Legion

Sunday 11th May marks a notable event in the annals of the local branch of the Royal British Legion which was formed here soon after the last war, in the parishes of Bigbury and Ringmore. In recent years the established Legion members were pleased to welcome Kingston ex-servicemen to join them and it became the wish and also the necessity to recognise this by giving the branch the name of Bigbury, Ringmore and Kingston. The addition of the Kingston personnel indicated that a new standard, bearing the full name of BIGBURY, RINGMORE & KINGSTON, was needed as it is the custom of Legion members to parade under the standard bearing their branch name.

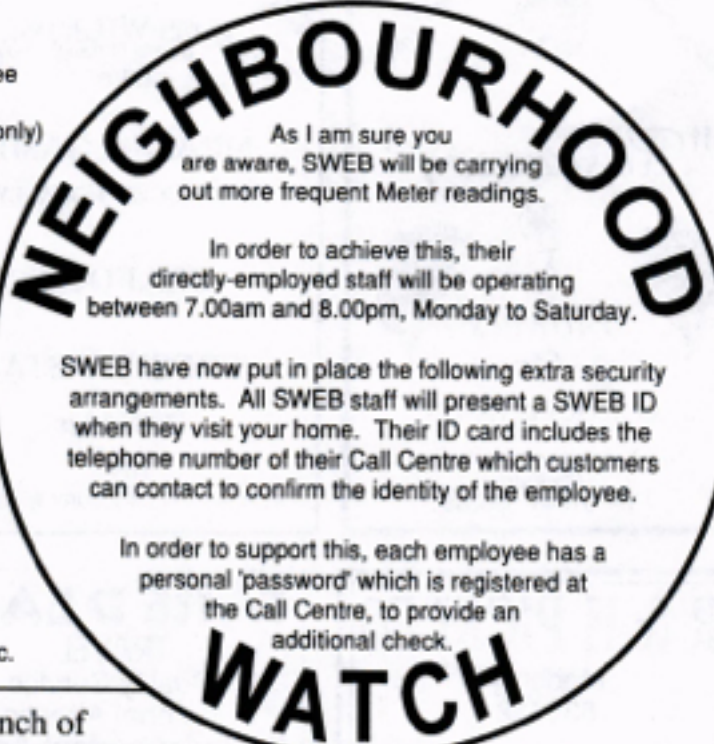
This new standard has been purchased wholly with donations from members and it will be dedicated on 11th May at St Lawrence, Bigbury. The service will take place at 11.00am and will be conducted by Rev Derek Matten, Honorary Chaplain to the Royal British Legion. PARISH COUNCIL MATTERS

Footpaths

Recently the Parish Council requested that the National Trust take remedial action to prevent stock gaining access to the Lower Manor Farm track and the nearby woodland.

Additional fencing has now been erected which should preclude further problems in this respect.

Information Note

The Parish Council has now been informed by the National Trust that they wish to rebuild the two stone walls that bisect the lower valley leading to Aymer Cove.

The purpose is to control the movement of stock as part of a programme to re-establish a more natural and attractive environment in that area. Since a supply of stone will have to be obtained as much of the original walling is missing and because of the time/cost involved in the project, a post and wire fence is to be erected for the present.

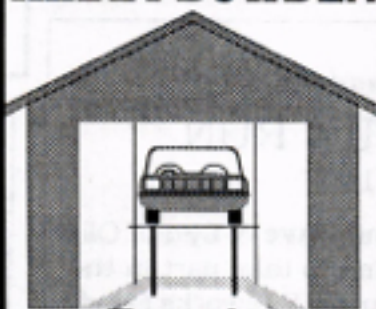

Inter Parish Quiz

Ringmore's annual foray into the Inter-Parish Quiz came to an end on the evening of Thursday 24th April after an interesting competition at Diptford Village Hall.

We had been well beaten in the first round of the main competition by Brixton who have now reached the final. Defeat at this stage, which qualifies teams for the Plate Competition, has been the pattern in recent years but we were almost denied our second chance for glory when initially we received a bye into the second round. Holbeton then failed to raise a team; thus Ringmore was restored to Round 1 and the rest is history, as they say.

Perhaps the teams which find their way to the Ken West Plate are not yet due their 15 minutes of fame but they are very relaxed about their position. This means that win, lose or draw the evening is light-hearted and enjoyable. Ringmore's team of Felicity Godwin, Terry Bent, and Geof Dykes were lead by their captain, Colin Jackson. We were pitted against Diptford and Ermington in a three-match contest of six rounds each, to produce a finalist. The winners would be the team which either won both matches or scored the highest overall total. Our Quizmaster was David Laidler from Modbury. We started against Ermington and progress was even. At the end of Round 2 the scores were 11-all. Ringmore had never been that far ahead! We had some difficulty with determining or guessing the average January temperatures of various cities around the world and Ermington fared little better but they ran out winners by 26 - 21. Next Ermington took on Diptford hoping, no doubt, that their confidence boosted by their victory would carry them through. It did not! Diptford crept ahead and held their lead, eventually winning 30 - 28. Arithmeticians came into their own now as it was calculated that Ringmore needed to score 34 points to beat Ermington and had to beat Diptford by 10 points. Unbelievably after two rounds Ringmore was 7 points in front but try as we did, we could not increase the margin. However, although we won the match we just missed our targets, winning by only 5 points and failing to score enough to overcome Ermington by 1 point. The result was 33 - 28. Thus Diptford won with a total of 58 points and Ringmore and Ermington shared second place on 54 points.

The night before, I had the task of being Quizmaster for the other half of the competition. There were four villages competing - Cornwood, Kingston, South Brent and Ugborough. The two quarter-finals were keenly fought: Cornwood vanquished Kingston and South Brent overcame Ugborough. In a tense final South Brent pipped Ugborough 33-31. Another enjoyable evening. This competition does foster goodwill between villages; usually the best team does win even if there is a little luck in the way the questions fall. Ringmore may not be feared by many teams but we have a reputation for the quality of our refreshments which puts us at the top of the Premier for catering! Well, you have to start somewhere.

The final of the Plate competition takes place at Ivybridge Community College at 7.30pm on Thursday 8th May. Originally there were to be joint quiz mistresses for the final, Judith Farmer and Angela Estyn-Jones. However Angela, who lives in Diptford, feels that because of Diptford's triumph, it would be impolitic for her to take part and has asked me to deputise. It is a great opportunity to test questions in readiness for next season's JE Quiz Night!
