



The Village Appraisal Committee met three times during May and after due consideration decided against following the formula produced by the Community Council for Devon. The 'official' questionnaire has a high percentage of obligatory questions which are solely to provide senior authorities (SHDC, DCC, Health Authorities) with information. For some subjects, Ringmore is not a large enough community to make the reponses of any value.

However there are areas where questions can be asked which, over time, could be guidance for the Parish Council either in direct provision. of facilities or in support of promoting the village's cause cutside the

Work is under way on producing a Survey which it is hoped will receive the full support of everyone in the Parish. To be of use a large response would be required and it is hoped to encourage this by personal contact. from the Committee through the delivery and collection of the forms. Results will be published in due course.


