The object, in the case of the Appraisal, is to obtain the collective view of everyone in the Parish, Challaborough and outlying districts included, on the topics covered. However, there is no obligation on anyone to respond to any of the questions on the forms. This applies equally to the questions which the RHS would like answered.

At the Parish Council meeting, the Managing Director of Plymouth Sound Radio requested the Council to circulate a questionnaire on listening habits. Please note that the draw for £100 of CDs has been deferred and will take place on Monday 14th July, on air!

So, you have the Appraisal, the RHS form and one from Plymouth Sound. These will be collected on either Saturday or Sunday, 5th & 6th July, by one of the Appraisal Committee. Please help the collectors by having them ready.

As Rachel Pitt has resigned from the Parish Council there are two vacancies. A sufficient number of electors has requested an election which means that were there to be no candidates, an election would be re-advertised until candidates came forward. These positions cannot be filled by co-optation
