The enclosed photo may be of interest to your History Society. It is of my great-grandfather and wife and taken from the family portrait I have. It is of Philip's ¹⁸⁷¹ ~~son John~~ wife ¹⁸⁷² ~~born Mary~~ ^{2d Mar} Triggs and wife Emma nee Small both of Ringmore. I'm afraid I can't date it but think they were married in the 1850's - most probably at Ringmore. He was at one time landlord of the "Hare & Hounds" at St Annes Chapel. What else he did I've never found out. She came to Ringmore (do my grandmother said) as governess to the Hingston-Randolphs.

The marriage was his second. His first wife died in childbirth - he already had 3 children Alfred, Bessie and Emily before the second marriage. The second marriage produced 2 children - John William ¹⁸⁷² and Kate, John William being my grandfather who married Janet Little of Scotland but they lived at Ringmore.

The odd angle of the photo is because the reflections ^{on} the portrait glass had to be avoided. It would appear from the photo Emma was bald but the much larger portrait shows her grey hair was combed tightly back.

Whether of interest to you or not I don't want the photo returned.
